Mayor's Message

Community Center

The City Council and I would like to applaud the efforts of the citizen's committee studying the possibility of building a community center in Mapleton. The committee held an open house May 26th where all citizens were invited to view the alternate draft proposals and make comment about the idea of size, type and location. They received only three negative comments, all others were positive or no comment at all.

The council has asked the City Administrator to send out RFPs (Requests for Proposal) based upon a 14,000 square foot building that would house the police department, court and council chamber, administrative offices, community room, and library. Once these responses come back providing us with an indication of the costs and we have a complete review of our financial position a sound decision can be made.

The committee has suggested that the library portion be built by donation from the community. It is suggested that everyone (including children) dig into their piggy banks, and give toward this important project. The City Council and myself have committed their salaries for the next year to go toward building a library. I believe we can do this as a community and have everyone feel a part of making it happen. This building would handle the new growth that we expect in the next few years.

We appreciate all those involved in the process and enjoy our working relationship with the school district. The location of the school is 1200 North and 400 East in Mapleton for grades 7, 8 and 9. We will continue to update you on the progress of the new Junior High school and look forward to the new school in Mapleton.

Cemetery

Earlier this year, the City Council created a special committee to look into the possibility of Mapleton City having its own cemetery. It was decided by the City Council that member Lori Allen oversee the committee. Also appointed to the committee were LuAnn Diamond, Rod Peterson, and Planning Director, Mathew Evans. The committee recently met to discuss the basic ideas of a cemetery, cost vs. benefit, and a possible location. It was agreed that the committee would research the feasibility of a possible cemetery by looking at costs to adjacent cities and communities our size. Although several possible sites were discussed, it was agreed that the criteria for a possible site would be one that had 10-15 acres, and is adjacent to, or close to an existing road.

One previous idea that had been mentioned by the local news media, was to have Mapleton City purchase vacant land within Mapleton City limits, next to the Springville Evergreen Cemetery. Although this idea sounds good in principal, it's important to understand that there is no land for sale next to the Springville Evergreen Cemetery, and the vacant parcels that exist are already approved for commercial projects which should be built within the next year.

Police Department

Dispatch Service

Mapleton City would like to thank the City of Springville for their years of service to our community for the dispatch services they provided. On June 27, 2004, Mapleton City will be contracting out the dispatch services to the Utah County Sheriff's Dispatch Center. Our contract with Springville City was going to increase not only this year but significantly in the years to come.

During negotiations with Springville City, we found our contact to be up this year on July 1st of 2004. We were unable to come to a plausible contract benefitting both parties so we researched and explored other options. We found that the Utah County Sheriffs Office was competitive and was the best option for us at this time. We have found a great service and partner with the Utah County Sheriffs Office.

All of Mapleton City's public safety departments, Fire, Ambulance, Police and Public Works, were involved in the discussions and had input in the process. After several meetings and discussions it was a unanimous decision that we switch to Utah County Dispatch. The effectiveness and cost savings for Mapleton City should reach around \$150,000 within the next five years.

The new dispatch number to call for Police, Fire, Ambulance service and after hours Public Works and Water emergencies will be 851-4100, which is the Utah County Sheriff's Dispatch. For emergencies call 911. You may call the Mapleton Police Department Monday thru Friday 8:00 am to 5:00 p.m. at 491-8048 for all other non-emergency police calls. This change in no way will affect our response times to Fire, Ambulance or Police calls. We will still have 24 hour seven day a week Fire, Police and Ambulance protection. If you have any questions please feel free to contact me or call me at 491-8048. Mapleton has and will always be a safe place to live.

Leash Law

With the warm weather now upon us I feel we should remind citizens about the Mapleton "Leash Law." I have had several reports of dogs running at large in the City over the past few weeks. With the warmer weather, many citizens walk in the early morning hours as early as 4:30 am Several of these citizens have expressed a concern about being approached by dogs running at large.

Mapleton City Code 6.08.100.A, reads; "Dog owners shall at all times keep their dog on a leash or within an enclosed area on their own property or the private property of another with the permission of the owner so as to prevent them from being at large or stray, from biting or harassing any person engaged in a lawful act, from interfering with the use of public property or with the use of another person's private property and from being in violation of this chapter. The owner or person charged with responsibility for a dog found running at large shall be strictly liable for any violation(s) committed by the dog, regardless of whether or not the person knows the dog is running at large."

If your dog or animal is caught, running at large you can be cited with a Class B misdemeanor. The fine for any Class B misdemeanor is up to \$1850.00 and or 180 days in jail. The dog or animal could be impounded and you would be responsible for the boarding fees. Just as a reminder, all dogs need to be licensed with Mapleton City and be current on their rabies vaccination shots. A dog license can be obtained at the Mapleton City Offices at 35 East Maple. Lets all work together to keep Mapleton a safer place to live and work.

Public Works

Pressurized Irrigation Service

Starting July 1st, the Mapleton City Council has approved a \$10.00 monthly fee to be assessed to every home which has a pressurized irrigation service lateral to the property and has water available for use but not currently being used. When connecting to the pressurized irrigation system the connection fees are:

Developer or resident connection to main:

\$146.05

Mapleton City installed connection to mains NW

1 inch- \$395.32

Mapleton City installed connections to main 900 S.

1 ½ inch- \$1059.87

2 inch- \$1059.87

The inspection fee is \$146.00. This fee is included in the connection fees for service laterals installed by the city. For developer or resident connection to main, the fee is only the \$146.00 inspection fee. Starting July 1st, the connection fee may be made in spread out in 10 monthly payments if done at that time.

Monthly fees for the pressurized irrigation are as follows:

1 inch- \$17.00

1 ½ inch- \$38.00

2 inch- \$76.00

Roads

More striping of the wider city roads will be done this summer to help with traffic and pedestrian use of our city streets.

Please continue helping keep the streets and storm drain system clean by sweeping the sidewalk, curb and gutter of lawn clippings and debris. We will continue street sweeping as the sweeper comes available.

Public Works Emergencies

From time to time we receive calls for water leaks or other public work related emergencies. To report water leaking in the street or between the water meter and the street, a sewer problem when connected to the city sewer system, damaged stop sign, severe street flooding during or after a heavy rain of snow melt, sudden settlement or hole in the asphalt roadway, **please call 851-4100 after 4:00 p.m. until 8:30 am on week days and any time on weekends. For emergencies during working hours 8:30 am to 4:00 p.m. call the City offices at 489-5655. For any police, fire or ambulance emergency call 911.**

Mapleton Public Works emergencies is now dispatched through Utah County Dispatch. Please state to dispatch name, address, phone number and what type of emergency as this is relayed to the person on call. The public works has at least one person on call for after hour emergencies during week days and as least two people anytime on weekends to cover the needs of the residents. They will assess the problem and if necessary, repair the problem immediately.

24th of July Celebration

Saturday, July 24th begins with a flag-raising ceremony at 6:30 am in the Mapleton Park on the corner of Main Street and Maple Street. There will be a 1 Mile Fun Run that begins at 7:00 am, and a 5K Run/Walk that begins at 7:30 am, both races starting at Central Bank. A hearty breakfast of pancakes, ham and eggs will be served at Mapleton Park from 7:00 - 9:30 am.

The parade begins at 9:00 am and will travel down Main Street from LDS Heritage Church (1600 North Main) to Mapleton Elementary. At 8:15 am the parade entries will be taken for parade participants. The theme has inspired many parade participants, from 15 LDS ward Primary floats, to bike, buggies, tractors, horsemen and maybe even the synchronized lawn mowers! There will be a special float portraying the theme "From All Nations...For all Nations" honoring all those who have served our country. Springville High Marching Band will provide stirring music, and the area royalty will be in attendance.

The town's Grand Marshall, Loeen Whiting, will be in the parade, and then featured at the bandstand immediately after the parade. Loeen was born on December 26, 1921. In 1942 she married Niel Whiting and they have 5 children, 15 grandchildren and 27 great-grandchildren. They worked as a family on the farm raising sheep, cattle and crops. David Kendall Log Cabin

560 West 1600 North (Moved to Mapleton Park)



Levi Kendall built this log cabin. He was born April 19, 1822 in Rock Port, Niagara, County of New York. He was a member of the advance guard of the First Company of Pioneers to enter the Salt Lake Valley, July 24, 1847. He assisted in the first plowing and planting after he arrived there. Levi was legally adopted by Brigham Young and was a veteran of the Echo Canyon and Indian Wars.

He and his wife, Eliza, came to Mapleton in the 1880's, as some of the first settlers. The home was built soon after their arrival to Mapleton, which was then called Union Bench. Morris Bird bought the log house and had it moved over by the Roswell Bird home, as it reminded him of the log cabin that was on the Bird property. He built a cement foundation for it to be put on. This cabin was built originally at 560 West 1600 North in Mapleton. Morris lived in the cabin during the summers.
