

Mayor's Message

Utah County Fair Board – Appointment of Board Member

This year the Utah County Commission has established a board for planning and running the Utah County Fair each year. The Board will be made up of 8 representatives from cities and town throughout our county. They are asking for a two year assignment, and couples are welcome. Board members would provide input regarding the Fair, give direction to the County Commission, represent and work to involve all county residents, prepare budget proposals, and execute County Fair activities each fall during the event. It is anticipated that the Board would hold their meetings once a month and the closing date for submitting your name of consideration is April 12th.

July 24th Pioneer Day Celebration – A Call for Sponsor(s)

Rabies and Dog Licensing Clinic

On April 21st between the hours of 10am-12pm Mapleton City and South Utah Valley Animal Shelter will be hosting an Animal Licensing and Rabies Clinic at the Mapleton Fire Station (305 North Main Street in Mapleton). A local Veterinarian will provide rabies shots for \$10 and other vaccinations for \$10-\$20; animal licenses \$15 for altered (spayed or neutered) and \$35 for unaltered. Pressurized Irrigation

Pressurized Irrigation is scheduled to be turned on Monday, April 16th. If you have any questions on fees or on connecting to the system, please contact the Public Works Department at 801-489-6253. Mapleton City has awarded a contract for the expansion of the Pressurized Irrigation to Johnston Phillips Inc. Work is slated to begin the first week of April to lay pipe and put in services to the Northeast side of the city. It will affect areas from Main Street to 1200 East and from 400 North to 1700 North. A City representative will be coming around to coordinate with the residents where the Pressurized Irrigation service will be placed at each lot where possible. Work on this portion of the project will be complete in July. Please direct any questions you may have to the Public Works Department and the number listed above.
