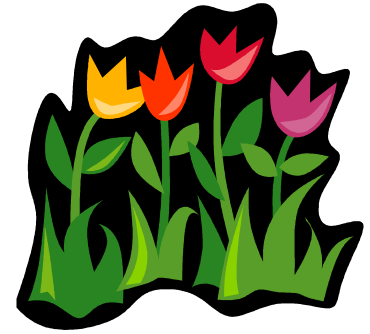

Leash Law

Mapleton City has a leash law which requires your dog to be on a leash at all times unless they are in an enclosed area on the home owner's property. You could be fined up to \$300 for violation of this law. Please keep all dogs on a leash when you are walking them, for their own safety and the safety of others. In addition, please make sure your dog has a current dog license so if your dog gets lost we can return it to you. The fine for not having your dog licensed is \$300.
