Mayor's Message

I never cease to be amazed by the generous efforts of people of all ages within our community geared towards helping those in need. I'm also humbled by the citizens throughout Mapleton that are continually looking out for each other.

The unusually long cold spell over the past month coupled with exceptional amounts of snowfall has caused severe difficulty on travelling throughout the city. It has been heartwarming to see so many residents come to the rescue of friends and neighbors, helping them clear their driveways, sidewalks and mailboxes.

In charity fundraising activities at Mapleton Junior High School 40 students donated their hair for the "Locks of Love" organization. Locks of Love is a public non-profit organization that provides hairpieces to financially disadvantaged children in the United States and Canada under age 21 suffering from long term medical hair loss from any diagnosis. Additionally MJHS students raised over \$2,800 that went towards buying Christmas gifts for this year's Shop With A Cop program. Last year the Utah County Shop With-A-Cop program was able to bring Christmas to 135 children throughout Utah County.

I attended an assembly at Hubble Creek Elementary School where the students donated 1,888 hours of service work during the month of December. They spent time working with the Newborn Intensive Care Unit (NICU) at Utah Valley Hospital, the Food & Care Coalition in Provo and many elderly citizens of Mapleton and the surrounding communities.

The Discovery Ranch students continue to provide many hours of donated labor for projects throughout the city such as helping with park maintenance and acting as buddies for special needs recreational programs. Recently, Discovery Ranch assisted our Police Department in loading several hundred water jugs into the basement storage area that are for sale to residents to use in their 72 hour survival kits.

Mapleton is great city comprised of great community minded people and as your Mayor, it is a real privilege and an honor to be able to serve with you. Thank you for all that you do.

I-15 Core Update

A look at I-15 CORE in 2011

In just a year, the I-15 Corridor Expansion (I-15 CORE) has gone from concept designs to full-scale construction on all 24 miles of the project. Since April 2010, crews have placed more than 4 million tons of fill, laid 20 miles of drainage pipe, placed 300,000 square yards of concrete roadway and put in 1.5 million hours of work. This year will be even busier, with work focusing on the three main areas:

- *Concrete Paving* – As more concrete roadway is constructed, traffic will be moved to the newly built lanes, resulting in major traffic shifts on I-15.
- *Interchange Work* – All 10 interchanges will be under construction in 2011, with closures affecting the Orem 1600 North, 800 North and Center Street interchanges, as well as American Fork 500 East and Provo Center Street and ramps at the U.S. 6/Spanish Fork Main Street Interchange.
- *Bridge Construction* – PRC plans to complete three bridge moves in Pleasant Grove, Lindon and Provo and continue work on more than 50 other bridges throughout the project.
