General Plan Update

The Planning Commission will be holding a public hearing on the latest update to the General Plan in sometime at the end of August or the beginning of September. We will have exact dates on the next news letter, so please be sure to check for them. The Planning Commission will also hold two General Plan work sessions to discuss the General Plan prior to the Public Hearing. The Public is welcome to attend the Work Sessions. Workshop dates will be July 13th and August for 14th 2006.

Street Lights

Utah Power and Light will be installing Street lights throughout the City in the Months of July and August. These lights will be installed in mostly newer subdivisions and developments, but there will be some installed in older subdivisions as well, mostly around major intersections. The decorative lights are a newer style and will have a cap which does not allow the light to shine upward. In areas where there are overhead power lines, the older style lights have to be used. The basic light locations have been determined by the City. Our goal is to provide light at street intersections, mainly for public safety. Exact light locations are mainly dictated by Utah Power and Light in relation with existing power sources.

Erma Mendenhall Hjorth



We count the beginning of this life on the day we enter the world through birth. This happened to Erma Mendenhall Hjorth on August 29, 1917 just minutes before her twin brother Earl followed her. Her Father, Richard Lovell Mendenhall and mother Hannah Mendenhall were already the parents of 4 children when the twins were born. This was at a time when many twins did not survive. Erma lived on a farm in Mapleton

hay and grain to feed the sheep that her father raised and sold to support the family and growing the other commodities needed to feed the family. She was schooled in Mapleton through grade 6 and then in Springville until her graduation from High School in 1936. On July 3rd, 1939 following his return from a mission to Norway, Hugh Hjorth from Springville asked her to marry him and she said yes. To this marriage they brought 11 children into the world. Erma will celebrate her 89th birthday in August and lives alone in her home in Mapleton. Besides being a mother of 11 children and 46 grandchildren, she now enjoys her 60 great grandchildren. One of her greatest assets, however, is her heritage and she cherished those who have gone on before her and strives to keep their memories alive in her posterity.

The Richard L. Mendenhall Home

1365 West 800 North Mapleton, Utah

The Richard L. Mendenhall home was completed in the summer of 1891. It had two big rooms upstairs with a large walk-in closet. There were three large rooms downstairs, a small kitchen and a small screened porch. Later this small porch was converted into a bathroom. It had high ceilings. They were ten feet high downstairs and eleven feet high upstairs. There were transoms above each door to ventilate the rooms. It had a rock foundation and thick adobe walls with straw and horsehair plaster walls. Richard and his wife, Mariah, lived in this home with their two children, Lovell and Irena, until they died. In 1902 Richard built a small apartment onto the east side of the home for his new bride. They lived there until Mariah's death, and then moved into the big home to take care of Richard Sr. He died in 1921. The outside of the home had not been changed except the addition of the front porch. William Mendenhall, father of Richard Sr. helped with the brick work. After the death of Richard Sr., Lovell Mendenhall and his wife, Hannah, lived in the home and raised their family of eight children. In the year of 1949 Lovell died and his daughter and son-in-law bought the home from the family. Hugh and Erma Hjorth lived in the home. The home is in good condition and has been well cared for all these many years. It was 100 years old in 1991. We are pleased to honor Erma Hjorth as the 2006 Grand Marshall in the 24th of July Parade.
