## Mayor's Message

#### Some Recent Big Win's for Mapleton City

First: This past Month, the Mountainland Association of Governments (MAG) Technical Advisory Committee (composed of the planners and engineers from the member cities) recommended funding for the Mapleton Lateral Canal Parkway Trail. The total funding pool available for all of the cities was \$22.1 million, and there were \$116 million in funding requests. Mapleton had requested \$3.05 million originally to fund the whole Lateral Canal Trail project, but the Technical Advisory Committee asked us to phase the trail, and recommended that we receive \$2.33 million, which would cover the trail project from 1600 North to Main Street on the South side of. At the following MAG Meeting, with all of the County Mayors and County Commissioners voting, Mapleton was successful in being awarded a grant of \$2.33 million dollars. Mapleton City will now be looking at other ways to fund the remaining portion of the trail through construction cost savings, use of impact fees, additional grant money, and other city funding options. The money will be given to Mapleton City in two parts, engineering costs in 2013, and construction costs on 2014.

**Second:** Arising from ongoing discussions with representatives of the Central Utah Project, the city's consultant engineers, RB&G, Mapleton City was advised recently that it has been awarded the \$8.2 million grant to begin construction of the Mapleton irrigation pond and the connection to the Mapleton Canal. With the Central Utah Project staff acting as agent for the Department of the Interior, we have confirmation that the value of pre-purchased assets, dry piped roads and the irrigation pond has reduced the city's matching grant cash obligation from \$3 million to approximately \$1.2 million.

**Third:** The release of the \$1.8 million dollars in capital matching grant money has enabled the city to review its position for proceeding with the construction of the proposed new Public Safety Building. This building would be located on the site of the former police station, library and adjacent property on Main Street, property already owned by Mapleton City. The architect's drawing for the building design was completed last summer and would be used for the bidding process. Mapleton City Council has approved the process to proceed through the bidding process to allow the city to better understand the current day costs for building the facility. A bid will be considered for approval at the July 20<sup>th</sup> Council Meeting.

**Fourth:** Congratulations to former Mayor and City Councilmember Jim Brady. Governor Gary R. Herbert appointed Jim Brady of Mapleton to serve as a district court judge in the state's Fourth Judicial District. The Fourth Judicial District serves Juab, Millard, Utah and Wasatch counties. Former Mayor Jim Brady was recommended unanimously by the State Senate Judiciary Confirmation Committee and was confirmed by the Senate on June 23, 2010. If you see Jim please congratulate him on his accomplishments.
