

November Election for Three City Council Vacancies

Declaration forms for residents wishing to submit their names as candidates for this year's Municipal elections are now available and should be returned to the City Recorder by no later than 5:00pm on July 15th. Ensign Bickford- land transfer into Mapleton City

On June 7th both Spanish Fork and Mapleton City Councils agreed to a boundary line adjustment of 482 acres of land, north of Highway 6 Spanish Fork Canyon. Under a new planning zone, the landowners the Ensign Bickford Company, plan to develop in phases up to 850 new homes on the land together with a commercial/retail business park to be located along the east side of Highway 89 and the north side of Highway 6. - EVEN NUMBERED HOUSES
 - Monday, Wednesday and Friday
 - Sunday may be used as a make-up day IF NEEDED.
- ODD NUMBERED HOUSES
 - Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday
 - Sunday may be used as a make-up day IF NEEDED.

Public Safety

24th of July Parade/Celebration

With the 24th of July approaching the City is again asking citizens in the parade, and on the parade route, NOT to throw candy. This is against state law and is very dangerous for people, mainly children, who are watching the parade who might run out in the road to pick up the candy. In addition, we are asking citizens who live on Main Street between 1200 North and Maple Street, not to park on the street on July 23rd between the hours of 6am and 10am. Let's continue to keep our Celebration a safe one.

Door-to-Door Solicitors

Mapleton City has an ordinance on door-to-door solicitation. If a person comes to your door selling anything they need to have a visible identification card issued by Mapleton city with their photograph on it, and signed on the back by a Mapleton City representative. Exceptions to the ordinance are political, religious, and State regulated charitable organizations. Call the Police Department with any problems at 801-489-9421.

Fireworks

Fireworks can cause extreme damage when not properly used. Please do not set off illegal fireworks as you will be issued a citation. The laws for what kind of fireworks can be set off have changed so please educate yourselves on what fireworks can and cannot be used.
