

July 24th Pioneer Day Celebration

Public Works

We would like to thank the residents of Mapleton for your patience with the road construction so far this year. The work will be completed as scheduled. With this construction, several improvements in the City have been accomplished.

- Culinary water lines which were old and undersized were replaced to prevent them from breaking. This has been a major cause of road deterioration in the City. The City is planning on replacing several miles of water lines in the years to come.
- Work has also continued on the Pressurized Irrigation System. With the addition of the irrigation pond being completed this year, it has allowed for consistent water pressure for all existing and new users.
- There are several areas where we have widened the shoulder of the road to make walking in our city safer for our children, runners, and bikers.

We are committed to continue to improve our City and the services you receive. As a reminder, please be aware of our Storm Drains this summer and keep your yard debris, grass clippings and fertilizer from being swept or washed out into the road or gutters. Public Safety

Motor Assisted Scooters

With summer now here we are seeing more juveniles riding motor assisted scooters. The law on motor assisted scooters can be found by looking on the internet for Utah Code Annotated Chapter 41-6a-1115. Some of the main points are a person under 15 years of age may not operate a motor assisted scooter using the motor unless they are under the direct supervision of a parent or guardian. In addition, a person may not ride on a highway with a posted speed limit greater than 25 miles per hour; any person under 18 years of age must wear a helmet.

Fireworks

Mapleton City Officers will be watching for the illegal use of fireworks. Because of the extreme risk of fire this year officers will be citing people found violating the fireworks laws. Fireworks are only allowed through the week of July 4th and July 24th, with no fireworks being allowed after 11pm. 24th of July Parade/Celebration

With the 24th of July approaching the City is again asking citizens in the parade and on the route not to throw candy. This is against state law and is very dangerous for people, mainly children, who are watching the parade that may run out in the road to pick up the candy. In addition, we are asking citizens who live on Main Street between 1200 North and Maple Street and on 1200 North between Main Street and 400 East not to park on the street on July 24th between the hours of 6am-10am. Let's continue to keep our 24th of July celebration a safe one!
