

### Public Works

#### Pressurized Irrigation Notice

It has been brought to the attention of the Public Works Department that there are several residences that have connected to the pressurized irrigation system and have not paid a connection fee and are not paying the monthly fee for the service. Starting this year we are metering usage on the pressurized irrigation and will be able to detect these illegal connections. If you are currently connected and do not pay a monthly fee for pressurized irrigation, please contact the City Office to take care of the fees before we find them and are forced to disconnect your service and back charge you for the connection or possibly enforce fines. #### Mapleton City Storm Water Information

Mapleton City is anxious to preserve the natural resources that make it beautiful. Because our ditches and gutters drain into surrounding streams that enter Utah Lake, it is important that we are vigilant in making sure pollutants do not find their way into a storm drain. If you witness the dumping of any pollutants (oil, concrete washout, paint, etc.) into a ditch, gutter or other storm drain system source, please call and report it to the Public Works Department at 801-489-6253. 
#### Invitation of Bids

## Public Safety

### Cautious Driving

With the end of school approaching there will be many more children out walking, riding bikes, and skate boarding. Please watch your speeds as you drive around Mapleton so we can keep our children safe. In addition, there are going to be several 5k runs going through our town so please watch out for runners.

### House Numbering

Please make sure your house number is visible on the front of your house so in case of an emergency we can locate your address.

### Thefts/Valuables

The Mapleton Police Department would like its citizens to keep a record of their valuables with serial numbers and pictures if possible. If something is stolen from you and we have the serial numbers there is a better chance of recovering the items taken.

## Ambulance

### Heart Attack Awareness

Symptoms of a heart attack can last 30 minutes or longer. Some people have a heart attack without having any symptoms (a light myocardial infarction). A silent MI can occur in any person, though it's more common among diabetics. Symptoms of a heart attack may include discomfort, pressure, heaviness, or pain in the chest, arm or below the breastbone. Discomfort radiating to the back, jaw, throat or arm. Fullness, indigestion, or choking feeling (may feel like heartburn). Sweating, nausea, vomiting, or dizziness. Extreme weakness, anxiety, or shortness of breath. Rapid or irregular heartbeats. The faster you get treatment for a heart attack, the better the chances of survival. Call 9-1-1 at the first sign of a heart attack.

### Stroke Awareness

The most common sign of stroke is sudden weakness of the face, arm or leg, most often on one side of the body. Other warning signs can include sudden confusions, trouble speaking or understanding speech. Sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes. Sudden trouble waking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination. Sudden severe headache with no known cause. The signs of a stroke depend on which side of the brain that's affected, the part of the brain, and how severely the brain is injured. Therefore, each person may have different stroke warning signs. Stroke may be associated with a headache, or may be completely painless. If you or someone you know is having these signs, call 9-1-1 for emergency transportation to a certified stroke center. Stroke is a medical emergency. Treatment is available, but only if a stroke is recognized in time. DO NOT try to diagnose the problem by yourself, and DO NOT wait to see if the symptoms go away on their own. Even if symptoms pass quickly, they could be an important warning that requires prompt medical attention. During a stroke 32,000 brain cells die per second. BE FAST!
