

Update on Pressurized Irrigation (PI)

The construction on the pressurized irrigation lines and laterals will be finishing up for the season this month and the irrigation pond will be finalized next spring. It has been a big project and we would like to thank the residents of the City for your cooperation and patience with the construction crews.

As a reminder please keep debris, yard waste and leaves cleaned out of the gutters around your homes before we start getting winter storms, in order to lessen the chance of plugging storm drains and causing flooding.

Traffic Concerns by Mapleton Jr. High School

Parents, we need your help in keeping your children safe by asking them not to walk, ride bikes, or skateboard in the roadway. There is a sidewalk on the north side of 1200 North that they should be using when walking east or west on 1200 North. In addition, we ask that you slow down while driving around the Junior High and all schools. Let's keep our children safe!
