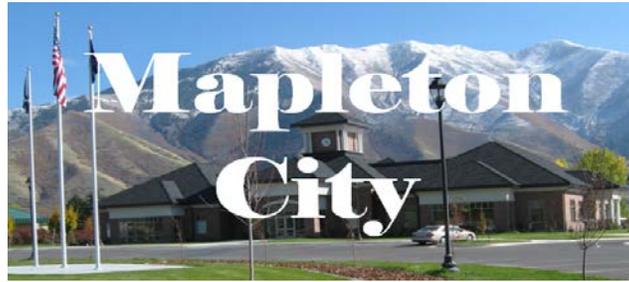

Public Works

Storm Drains

Mapleton City is anxious to preserve the natural resources that make it beautiful. Because our ditches and gutters drain into surrounding streams that enter Utah Lake, it is important that we are vigilant in making sure pollutants do not find their way into the storm drain. If you witness the dumping of pollutants into a ditch, gutter or other storm drain system source, please call and report it to the Public Works Office at 801-489-6253.

Illicit discharges enter the Mapleton City storm water system through either direct connections (e.g. wastewater piping either mistakenly or deliberately to storm drains) or indirect connections (e.g. infiltration into the Mapleton City storm water system from cracked sanitary systems, spills collected by drain outlets, or paint or used oil dumped directly into the drain). The result is untreated discharges that contribute high levels of pollutants, including heavy metals, toxins, oil and grease solvents, nutrients, viruses and bacteria to receiving water bodies. Pollutant levels from these illicit discharges have been shown in EPA studies to be high enough to significantly degrade receiving water quality and threaten aquatic, wildlife and human health.


