

## Mayor's Message

You have probably started to notice candidate signs being placed around town regarding the upcoming Mapleton City's Municipal General Election. This year's election includes two City Council Seats and one Mayoral Seat.

The Mayoral Seat only had one candidate declare, myself (Mayor Brian Wall), so currently I'm running uncontested. The candidates running for the two City Council Seats are Jim Lundberg, Ryan Farnworth, and Josh Diamond. You will notice that the candidate's names are not listed in alphabetical order like they have been in previous years based on the fact that the Lt. Governor's Office has generated a random alphabet list and that is how we have been instructed to generate the ballots.

In order for you to get to know the candidates better the Mapleton City Youth Council will be sponsoring a "Meet the Candidates Night" held at the Mapleton City Council Chambers on Tuesday, October 15<sup>th</sup> from 6:00pm to 9:00 pm. The meeting will also include a mix and mingle starting at 6:00 pm which will allow each of you the opportunity to talk with the candidates individually.

Early voting will be held at the Mapleton City Office located at 125 West 400 North starting on Tuesday, October 22<sup>nd</sup> and running thru Friday, November 1<sup>st</sup>. The hours will be from 9:00am to 3:00pm Monday thru Friday with the exception of November 1<sup>st</sup> in which the polls will be open until 5:00pm.

The General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 5<sup>th</sup> and polls will be open from 7:00am to 8:00pm. Precincts MA 01, 02, and 05 will vote at the Mapleton City Office located at 125 West 400 North and MA 03 and 04 will vote at Hobbles Creek Elementary located at 1045 East 1200 North.

# Public Safety

## Winter Parking

With winter just around the corner it is time to remove all boats, trailers, and vehicles parked on the side of the roadway. During the months of November, December, January, February and March it is illegal to leave your vehicle parked on the side of the road between the hours of 11:00pm and 6:00am. In addition, during any months you cannot leave your vehicle parked on the side of the road for more than 48 hours without moving it. The City's street sweeper will be coming through the neighborhoods to clean out the gutters before winter. Also the snow plow trucks will need to have the vehicles off the street so they can plow the roads effectively and not damage any vehicles.

## Internet Fraud

There are several Internet frauds going on right now and one of them is where you purchase an item off of KSL.com and the person sends you a check for several hundred dollars over the purchase price. They then ask you to cash the check and send them the difference back. Later on you will learn the check was not a valid check. # Mapleton Public Works

## Fall has arrived!

Please keep leaves and yard debris out of the gutters, ditches, and roadways. This will help keep the storm drains clean and minimize potential flooding when the winter storms hit.

The nights are also getting longer and if you notice an intersection that may need a street light or that a street light is not working contact Public Works.

Take a minute this month to inspect your water meter. Water Meters barrels are typically located in front of your home, please make sure that your meter is not covered by landscaping or dirt, and that there is a lid that fits tightly in place.

Weather permitting; the pressurized irrigation system will remain on through the end of October.

# Mapleton Springville Pipeline

A new water regulating tank is currently being built on the hill just north of US 6 and east of Highway 89. The regulating tank helps provide stable pressures in the Mapleton Springville Pipeline. Water flowing through the tank comes from Strawberry Reservoir via the Diamond Fork System and the Spanish Fork Canyon Pipeline and can be used for secondary irrigation water in Mapleton and Springville as well as providing irrigation water for the Mapleton Irrigation Company and the Springville Irrigation Company. The work is scheduled to be completed by November 30, 2014.

# Community Development

## What are impact fees, how much are they and who pays them?

Impact fees are imposed when property is developed to pay for all, or a portion of the costs of providing public services to and for the new development. These fees are implemented to help reduce the economic burden on the City that result from population growth. The City charges impact fees for culinary water, pressurized irrigation, sewer, public safety (police & fire), and parks and recreation. No impact fees are charged for alterations to existing single-family residences.

The City's impact fees are collected in two parts. First, prior to a residential subdivision plat being recorded, the developer must pay \$4,528 per lot in impacts fees. Second, prior to the issuance of a building permit, an additional impact fee of \$6,968 is collected per lot. Impact fees are slightly different for commercial development.
