## Mayor's Message

*"Developer, Mapleton reach a deal; lawsuit tossed"* By Donald W. Meyers – The Salt Lake Tribune – August 13, 2011.

*"Gibby, Mapleton resolve what could be final legal action. A decade-long legal battle appears to be over."* By Heidi Toth – Daily Herald – August 11, 2011.

At a Federal Court Hearing held August 9<sup>th</sup>, Judge Benson approved the city's motion for the court to enforce the dismissal of Dr. Gibby's Federal Civil Lawsuit against the City based upon a stipulation between the City and the landowner. The action was taken to uphold the terms of a Settlement Agreement approved by City Council earlier this year at Dr. Gibby's request.

Under the terms of the agreement, the landowner promised to withdraw all lawsuits against the City if the City agreed to rezone an additional nine acres of his land to facilitate development along the bench at Maple Mountain.

The rezone was approved by the City Council but the landowner refused to withdraw his Federal lawsuit, as promised.

The action by the Federal Court and a stipulation dismissal of another pending lawsuit now brings to an end all litigation that has taken place over the past nine years and the City is now in the process of considering the landowner's application for a final plat layout for the residential development of his property.

I anticipate the application process will be completed toward the end of November enabling Dr. Gibby to proceed with the construction of a subdivision as approved by the Planning Commission and City Council.

## Public Works

### Pressurized Irrigation

Most residents have seen all the construction on our roads to place the pipe for the expansion of the City pressurized irrigation system. But what you may not have seen is the irrigation pond that is also being re-built from property purchased from the Mapleton Irrigation Company. Access to the pond will be provided at Maple Street and Dogwood Drive. The irrigation pond runs south along the base of the mountain between these two streets and will provide water storage for the pressurized irrigation system. If you are interested in viewing this project, go to the top of Dogwood Drive to get the best overlook of the reservoir. Since construction is still in progress, please be cautious of equipment and courteous to the neighbors. You may also view the progress of the reservoir on the city website ([www.mapleton.org](http://www.mapleton.org)) with pictures that are being taken at various stages of the project. Currently there is fabric and rubber liner being placed in the reservoir.

Construction on the pressurized system continues on schedule, as a result of our C.U.P. Grant plus excellent bid prices the pressure irrigation distribution lines will be expanded to the north of 400 North, bringing the pressurized irrigation to several more residents in selected areas.
