Dates for Christmas Tree removal will take place January 27th thru the 29th. Please place your trees at the curbside by 7am on the FIRST scheduled pickup day. Trees will be recycled by grinding them up for mulch, therefore all miscellaneous items on the tree must be removed (no lights, ornaments, decorations, bags or flocked trees, etc.).

Can I have a second kitchen in my house?

A single family residence may have a second kitchen provided a building permit is obtained from the City and the second kitchen is for family use only. The issuance of a permit for a second kitchen does not authorize the creation of an accessory apartment that could be rented out. Public Works

The City currently has 6 snow plow trucks. Plowing begins following an accumulation of 2" or greater snowfall on the main priority roads followed by local subdivision streets. Cul-de-sacs and dead end streets are the last priority; however, we strive to get to them as soon as possible. We aim to have the main roads cleared within 24 hours of the end of any storm, and the local subdivision streets, dead-end streets, and cul-de-sacs within 72 hours.

Roads cannot be cleared effectively with vehicles parked on the streets. It is against the law to park any vehicle on the city streets overnight from November through March and recently there have been several citations issued.
