

Public Works

Snow Plowing

The City currently has 6 snow plow trucks. Plowing begins following an accumulation of 2" or greater snowfall on the main priority roads followed by local subdivision streets. Cul-de-sacs and dead end streets are the last priority; however, we strive to get to them as soon as possible. We aim to have the main roads cleared within 24 hours of the end of any storm, and the local subdivision streets, dead-end streets, and cul-de-sacs within 72 hours.

Roads cannot be cleared effectively with vehicles parked on the sides of the streets. It is against the law to park any vehicle on city streets overnight from November through March, and recently there have been several citations issued.

Public Safety

Police Body Cameras

The Mapleton Police Department is pleased and excited to announce that we are one of the first departments in Utah County to have all of our officers equipped with body cameras. The cameras will be affixed to all of our officers' uniforms and will assist in capturing all interactions our officers have with citizens on a daily basis. This new measure will reduce liability for our officers and increase their accountability, as well as the accountability of the public they serve. This is one of many new developments that our department is making to increase trust and ensure the safety of the citizens of Mapleton City and Utah County. We are grateful to the City Council for providing the department with the cameras, and for their support and foresight in regards to the safety of our citizens and officers.

Speeding in School Zones

We are sure many parents have seen us as they are taking their kids to school. We are the officers who sit by the Elementary and Junior High Schools with our red and blue lights flashing. This is to warn drivers that they are exceeding the 20 mph or 25 mph speed limit by our schools. We have found that we can slow down a lot more cars this way than by stopping and citing one driver. However, we want drivers to be aware that moving forward as a Police Department, we will be stepping up our enforcement in and around the schools and will be giving citations to those drivers who are not following the set speed limit of the school zones. This increased enforcement will help to keep all of our children safe as they are going to and from school, and hopefully limit the amount of drivers who are speeding through school zones.

Shop with a Cop

Mapleton City would like to thank all those who donated to the Shop with a Cop Program. This year's event was a great success, as it has been in the past. Because of your donations, and the City's, we were able to give several children a better Christmas.
