Utility Rate Changes

For any questions regarding the rate changes effective July 1, 2014 to both Culinary and Pressurized Irrigation (PI) Water I recommend you read the previous April, May, and June's Mayor's Message provided in the City Newsletter. As a clarification to the June Newsletter to receive the grant the City used the value of the storage reservoir property, which was transferred to the City by Mapleton Irrigation Company. Payment for the property was through Transferable Development Rights issued to the Irrigation Company by the City. The value of the property and the payment of Transferable Developments Rights was approximately \$1.86M.

Senior Citizen \$400 Connection Fee Waiver

Mapleton City recognizes the need for exceptions to the Pressurized Irrigation (PI) \$400 connection fee due to possible financial hardships. To apply, a qualifying senior must complete a written application and provide a copy of a recent tax form, driver's license, and State ID card or birth certificate. If the City determines the senior meets the qualifications, the City will waive the required PI connection fee. For any questions regarding qualification requirements or to obtain an application please feel free to contact the Mapleton City Utility Billing Department located at the City Center (125 West 400 North).

Each month the Planning Commission and the City Council review development applications (subdivisions, conditional use permits, rezone requests, etc.) as part of their regularly scheduled meetings. Members of the public can attend these meetings and comment on the applications being presented. Staff strongly encourages members of the public that have specific questions regarding a particular application to contact staff prior to the meeting. This allows members of the public to be better informed and can clarify misconceptions or misunderstandings that may exist about a particular project. This also allows staff to research a particular topic or concern that is of importance to the public prior to the public meeting. Outdoor Watering Tips

Water is usually applied too often and left on too long when watering lawns and often ends up running down the gutter. Turf studies show that most lawns only need to be watered once every 3 or 4 days to stay healthy and green. Water infrequently and deeply. A large water bill for a small lawn could mean it is being overwatered. Besides being expensive, overwatering damages the lawn, contributing to poor growth, and causes serious disease problems.
