Public Safety

The beginning of a new year gives us a chance to reflect on some of the incidents that have taken place during 2017. As our community continues to grow we are seeing an increase in calls for service. Since the beginning of 2015 we have seen an approximate 10% increase in calls for service, going from 3069 to 3381 calls per year. Additionally, this past year your officers have been tasked with several significant life changing incidents that have received significant media attention. Christmas Tree Pick-Up

Republic Services will provide a dumpster from January 2nd through January 14th. The dumpster (for Christmas Trees ONLY) will be located on the southeast corner of 300 West 400 North (west of City Hall). Please enter off 300 West. In efforts to help accommodate those who like to leave their Christmas trees up longer, Republic Services will be picking up Christmas trees placed by the curb starting February 1st. All trees must be placed by the curb no later than that day to ensure removal.

Know your snow responsibilities

- ❖ Snow and ice removed from sidewalks and driveways MAY NOT be pushed into the road or right-of-way.
- ❖ If possible, avoid parking on the street during or following a snow storm. Keeping the street clear of vehicles will make it easier and more effective to plow snow on your street.
- ❖ Owners and or occupants are responsible for keeping their sidewalks clear of snow & ice.
- ❖ Landlords and tenants should establish in the rental agreement who will be responsible for snow & ice removal.
- ❖ Mapleton City puts its best plow forward when it comes to snow removal. While it takes time to get around the entire City, and each snow storm presents different challenges, our crew is dedicated to providing the best level of service.

Community CPR Training and Certification Class for 2018

Beginning Saturday, January 27th, at 9am, the EMS Department will provide a monthly public CPR class at the Mapleton Public Safety Building for residents and friends of Mapleton.

You must sign up in advance by calling the city offices to get on the class list for that month – class size is limited. The class is free, but if you want a certification from the American Heart Association there is a cost payable at the beginning of the class.

Each class will last approximately three hours and will be held the fourth Saturday of each month (dates can be found at www.mapleton.org). Only one class is needed to certify or re-certify.
