

## Mayor's Message

### Memorial Day Celebration

Mapleton City will be holding its annual Flag Raising Ceremony on Memorial Day, Monday, May 30<sup>th</sup> at 9am. This will be held at the Mapleton City Park (corner of Main and Maple Street). A pancake breakfast will take place in the pavilion after the Ceremony. We encourage families to bring your children to this special occasion and help them understand the value of freedom and the sacrifices made to keep our country free.

The Maple Mountain High School Band, under the direction of Chris Wilson, will provide the music and retired Korean War Veteran Richard Howell will be the featured speaker. To ensure a seat for the service, those attending may want to bring a lawn chair. I encourage each of you to come to this patriotic service and give thanks to the freedoms we all enjoy.

### Mapleton Lateral Canal Trail

Construction of phase 1 of the Mapleton Lateral Canal Trail is progressing on schedule. Phase 1 will extend from Hobbler Creek Canyon in the north to about 2200 South Main Street in the South. You've probably seen that much of the trail corridor has been graded, the new pedestrian bridge at 1900 East across Hobbler Creek has been installed and some paving has been placed. It is anticipated that the paving will be completed by mid-May with final trail completion sometime in mid-June. I will include a date for a ribbon cutting ceremony in the June Newsletter. Please note that the trail corridor is not open for public use until after the ribbon cutting ceremony.

## Public Works

Did you know that we live in the 2<sup>nd</sup> driest state in the nation, and Utah residents use 60 – 70% of their water on their outdoor landscapes?

Some ways that you can conserve water this summer:

- Check your sprinkling system for proper coverage and routinely check your system for leaks.
- Adjust sprinkler heads so that water is not spraying onto the sidewalk or in the street.
- Water infrequently and deeply in order to encourage plants to develop deep root systems.
