

We invite everyone to create a one-of-a-kind scarecrow for this competition. Individuals, families, businesses, or organizations can participate for fun prizes! Decorating and set-up will take place Saturday, October 15th, at the Mapleton City Park, located at the corner of Main and Maple Street, from 9am-2pm.

Not a scarecrow maker? Be a scarecrow judge! The community scarecrow viewing and judging event will be held that same day from 3pm-5pm. Please come and walk among the scarecrows and cast a vote for your favorite! It will be a "spectacular" Fall afternoon in the park that you won't want to miss! Public Works

Pressurized Irrigation

With summer winding down, it will soon be time to turn off outside sprinkling systems. We have noticed that there are quite a few residents that are shutting their pressurized irrigation off with the city's shut off valve that is connected to the meter (City valve is between the meter and the road). This practice is prohibited by the City Code. Each property owner is required to install an irrigation box with a separate shut off valve so they are able to control their own system. Please use only your valve to shut off your system. If at any time you tamper with or shut off the cities valve or meters, you will be liable for any damage you cause. The City code reads:

3.30.090: SHUT OFF VALVE:

Persons connecting to the pressurized irrigation system shall be required to provide and install a valve independent of the city's shut off valve with which they may control the pressurized irrigation service to their premises. At no time will a person be allowed to tamper with or operate the city's shut off valve unless acting under the direction of the city public works director.

The pressurized irrigation system will remain on through the end of October weather permitting. Please contact the Public Works department if you have any questions regarding the pressurized irrigation system.

Public Safety

Criminal Trespassing

Mapleton Police Department would like to remind citizens of the state law pertaining to Criminal Trespassing. A portion of the trespass code reads:

A person is guilty of criminal trespass if;

- 1- *The person enters or remains unlawfully on property and:*
 - a. *Intends to cause annoyance or injury to a person, or damage property*
 - b. *Intends to commit a crime*
 - c. *Is reckless as to whether his presence will cause fear for the safety of another*
- 2- *Knowing the person's entry is unlawful, the person enters or remains on property as to which notice against entering is given by:*
 - a. *Personal communication to the actor by the owner or someone with authority to act as the owner*
 - b. *Fencing or other enclosure obviously designed to exclude intruders*
 - c. *Posting of signs reasonably likely to come to the attention of intruders*
- 3- *Criminal Trespass is a class B misdemeanor.*

The police department has received calls from property owners in the city asking us to enforce the trespassing laws. If you come across private property that is posted, please stay out. Officers will respond and handle the situation accordingly.

Fire Department

Mapleton Fire Department would like to remind all residents with the fast approaching colder temperatures to have your furnaces inspected making sure they are operating properly. This is the time of year we start receiving higher call volume for CARBON MONOXIDE alarms. By having your furnace inspected it greatly reduces the chances of problems relating to Carbon Monoxide. We would also like to remind everyone to check your Smoke alarms and Carbon Monoxide alarms and replace the batteries at least once a year, also Smoke and Carbon Monoxide alarms need to be replaced every 10 years. This is also a good time to check Chimneys and Flue Pipes for any debris or soot build up, as this can lead to Chimney fires and house fires.

Fire Hydrants

We want to remind everyone to keep Fire Hydrants clear of any obstructions including, when landscaping yards, snow removal and parking vehicles or trailers.

Mapleton Fire Department will be at the Fire station passing out candy again this year for Halloween, we hope to see you there.
