

Summer Safety

With warm weather also comes a higher crime rate. Please watch your neighborhoods for suspicious activity and call the Police Department if you notice something out of the ordinary. If you leave for a summer vacation do not post on social media that you will be gone. Let a trusted neighbor know that you will be out of town and to help watch your residence. Remember to lock all sheds and keep garages closed at night. Also, with the warmer weather and school being out for the summer, children will be outside playing, riding bikes, and scooters. Please be observant of children playing and slow down while driving. Encourage your own children to wear a helmet while riding a bike, scooter or skateboard.

Dogs on the Loose

Mapleton City has a problem with dogs running loose. As a reminder, your dog needs to be on a leash at all times unless it is in a fenced area. Mapleton Officers are spending a lot of time handling animal at large calls with dogs roaming loose. If your dog is not on a leash, or is running at large, you could receive a citation with a fine of up to \$299.00.

Schedule a FREE Outdoor Water Check

The water check program is a free service sponsored by Central Utah Water Conservancy District and is available from May through August.

A water check analyzes the efficiency of your automated sprinkler system. Trained workers will perform the water check at your home and provide you with a customized watering schedule. The tests that will be performed include soil type, grass root depth, sprinkler distribution uniformity and water pressure. The entire process takes approximately one hour. You can schedule an appointment by calling 877-728-3420.
