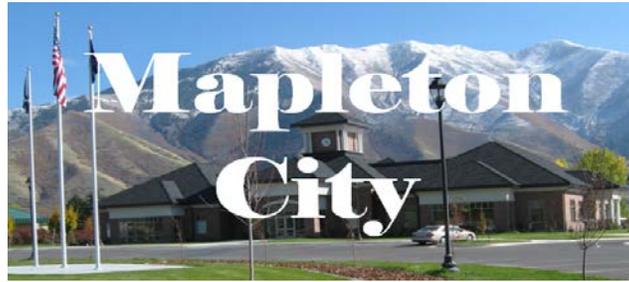

Mayor's Message

MyMapleton.org Survey

I am excited to offer you as a citizen the great opportunity to participate in the MyMapleton community survey. The MyMapleton survey is a tool used to determine your personal views regarding our city, what advancements and improvements you would like to see, and where you hope the city will be in the future.

In the first couple of weeks in September, the city will be sending every household instructions and details on completing the survey so keep an eye out for additional information delivered in your mail. You may take the MyMapleton survey from any computer that has web access. The city will provide assistance for you if you desire to take the survey and cannot take it from your own devices. The survey should take about 15-20 minutes to complete. We want everyone to have the opportunity to take the survey.

Mapleton City has contracted with a third party provider who has written the survey and will gather and store all data. They will compile the data and present it to the city council later this fall. There is no personal information requested in the survey it is completely confidential and random. In fact, you never put your name on the survey. There is absolutely no way of someone else looking at your personal information or tracking your answers to any questions.

Water Rates

With one year of PI/Culinary water metering history, as promised the city council and staff reviewed usage, revenue, future capital projects and expansion of PI to fund and total debt services. We are happy to report that retroactive on your September bill the water rates have been reduced. Culinary water rates were reduced by .25 per tier and PI was reduced by .50 per tier. These new rates affect all citizens in Mapleton and will offer substantial water savings over the course of a year.

Water Conservation

This year Mapleton was one of the only cities within Utah County "not" to enact or enforce a water conservation policy. Much of the credit goes to you, the citizens, for managing this precious resource, along with eliminating the old flat pay-unlimited use model and introducing a tiered use model, Mapleton City residents have saved approximately 56 million gallons of water over last year. AWESOME JOB!!! Keep it up.

Pressurized Water

Pressurized Irrigation

As a reminder, City Code, Chapter (13.30.020) states, that no connection shall be made to the pressurized irrigation system until a permit has been issued. Also, City Code, Chapter (13.30.080) states that the owner of the premises must pay all required fees and charges applicable before using the pressurized irrigation system. You are required to get an inspection after you have connected and prior to using the system. If it is found that there has been usage without following proper procedures for connection, the City will back bill for that usage.


Public Works

With summer coming to an end, it will soon be time to turn off outside sprinkling systems. We have noticed that there are quite a few residents that are shutting their pressurized irrigation off with the city's shut off valve that is connected to the meter (City valve is between the meter and the road). This practice is prohibited by the City Code. Each property owner is required to install an irrigation box with a separate shut off valve so they are able to control their own system. Please use only your valve to shut off your system. If at any time you tamper with or shut off the city's valve or meters, you will be liable for any damage you cause. The City code reads:

3.30.090: SHUT OFF VALVE:

Persons connecting to the pressurized irrigation system shall be required to provide and install a valve independent of the city's shut off valve with which they may control the pressurized irrigation service to their premises. At no time will a person be allowed to tamper with or operate the city's shut off valve unless acting under the direction of the city public works director.
