Public Works

Pressurized Irrigation

Weather permitting the City will be turning on the Pressurized Irrigation (PI) system on Monday, April 16th. Please make sure that you follow city code on your pressurized irrigation connection. If you have connected or are planning on connecting to the pressurized irrigation system, be aware that you are required to have your connection inspected prior to use. The city requires that each user provides and installs a valve independent of the city's shut off valve that the user can control the pressurized irrigation to their premises. It is against city code for a person to tamper with or operate the city's shut off valve. (Mapleton City Code Section 13.30.090).

Also, be aware that a cross connection between the pressurized irrigation system and the culinary water system is a violation of State and Municipal Code (Mapleton City Code Section 13.30, Class B misdemeanor). Connection to a secondary water source, such as pressurized irrigation, requires a physical air gap, not just a valve between the secondary and culinary systems. As part of our Cross-Connection Program, and for public awareness, we do periodic checks on the system. Mapleton Fire Department

As spring is upon us we will be starting to spend more time outside in our yards enjoying the warm weather. With the warming weather we ask you to be aware and pay extra attention to pedestrians close to the roadways and be extra vigilant around schools and in the early mornings and afternoons when children are traveling to and from school.

Utah County Open Burn

The spring open burn runs from March 30th through May 30th this year. We have already had several calls this year regarding grass fires, and ditch fires. Everyone that plans on burning is required to submit for a burn permit online. There are also restrictions for an Open Burn. You are required to attend to the fire the entire time it is actively burning, meaning until it has been completely extinguished. It is PROHIBITED to burn anything hazardous and/or toxic (garbage, ALL building materials, tires, mattresses, etc.) To access the burn permit online you can visit the Mapleton City Website and click on the link under the Open Burn section, or go to the Utah County Open Burn website directly at <http://air.utah.gov/OpenBurning/form/index.php>.

Public Safety

As warmer weather arrives more people will be using our wonderful Mapleton Parkway Trail. **Over the past two summers we have asked for residents help in keeping motorized vehicles, especially dirt bikes, off the trail.** Some have respected that request and we appreciate that, however many have not and continue to ride motorized vehicles on our trail and adjacent private property. Many trail users have voiced concerns for their safety as speeding dirt bikes pass them by. The Police Department agrees that this poses a significant risk to our residents that are using the trail system lawfully. **Officers will be patrolling the trail heavily and will be stopping and acting on violations that they witness on the trail and adjacent private property.** The police department has been in communication with adjacent property owners and will be enforcing trespassing violations as well. **We are asking residents to keep all motorized vehicles off the trail, as well as asking parents of juveniles who ride their dirt bikes on the street, trails, and private property to educate their children before enforcement action is taken.**

Over the years many people have used the south area gravel pits as a shooting area. **This will not be allowed any further as there is no shooting allowed within the city limits of Mapleton, the property owner has requested that there not be anyone on the property, and most importantly the Mapleton Parkway Trail runs is close to the range. Officers have found rifle targets set up directly in line with the trail system. There is absolutely no shooting allowed in this area!**
