Curfew Ordinance

Due to a seemingly ever-increasing incidence of violence and other crime among juveniles in Utah County, being both drug related and gang related, that such crimes may be significantly inhibited and reduced by the enactment and enforcement of local law establishing a curfew prohibiting juveniles from remaining idly and purposelessly on the public streets late at night.

9.20.040: CURFEW HOURS:

C. Sixteen Year Old Curfew: It shall be unlawful for any minor under the age of sixteen (16) years to remain or loiter upon any of the sidewalks, streets, alleys or public places in Mapleton City between the hours of eleven o'clock (11:00) P.M. and five o'clock (5:00) A.M. the following morning.

D. Eighteen Year Old Curfew: It shall be unlawful for any minor under the age of eighteen (18) years to remain or loiter upon any of the sidewalks, streets, alleys or public places in Mapleton City, between the hours of eleven o'clock (11:00) P.M. and five o'clock (5:00) A.M. the following morning, Sunday through Thursday, and between the hours of one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and five o'clock (5:00) A.M. Saturday and Sunday.

Mapleton Promise Scholarship

These scholarships are given to high school seniors who are residents of Mapleton, appreciate and desire more education, have adequate grades, and possess personal initiative. This year there were 10 applicants for the scholarship.

Public Works

As you are probably by now aware, we are deep into construction season which means orange barrels, flaggers, and traffic delays but also the hope of nice new smooth road surfaces. There are several projects going on right now in Mapleton. UDOT is resurfacing Highway 89 from the south end of town up to approximately 1200 North. This will include updating some pedestrian ramps, grinding the existing road surface and laying a brand new 2" overlay of asphalt. Mapleton City is resurfacing several roads ranging from a full depth reclamation and rebuild to edge mill and 2" overlay. The roads that will be affected over the next month or so are:

- US89: US6 to 1200 NORTH
- 1200 NORTH: MAIN STREET to 1000 EAST
- 600 NORTH: 200 WEST to MAIN STREET
- 300 WEST: MAPLE STREET to 600 NORTH
- 800 WEST: MAPLE STREET to 800 SOUTH
- 800 SOUTH: US89 to 1200 WEST
- 1600 SOUTH: MAIN STREET to 800 EAST
- 800 WEST: 1600 SOUTH to 2000 SOUTH
- 2000 SOUTH: 800 WEST to MONTA VISTA DRIVE
- PARK MEADOWS DRIVE: US89 to 2000 SOUTH
- 2000 SOUTH: PARK MEADOWS DRIVE to 800 WEST
- ELKVIEW CIRCLE
- NORTH PARK PARKING LOT
- IRA ALLEN PARK SOUTH PARKING LOT

Please be safe and courteous as you travel through work zones and we appreciate your patience as we work hard to improve Mapleton City Streets. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Public Works at 801-489-6253.

Fire Department

As summer is upon us we will be spending more time outdoors working on our yards and having fun in the summer sun. We at Mapleton Fire Department would like to remind you that when landscaping, pay special attention to Fire Hydrants, there can be NO obstruction within 3 feet of a Fire Hydrant. This year the Utah State Laws have changed regarding the days allowed to discharge Fireworks, which are as follows:

Between the hours of 11am and 11pm except as noted:

- July 2 - July 5 (July 4 hours extended to Midnight)
- July 22 - July 25 (July 24 hours extended to Midnight)
- December 31 (11am - 1am January 1)

The boundary map is located on the City website, and posted on the front window of both the City Building and the Fire Station. Have a safe and fun summer.

NOTICE TO MAPLETON CITY UTILITY CUSTOMERS

Utah State Code 10-6-135(3)(d) requires that the City provide an annual disclosure on funds transferred from a utility enterprise fund to any other fund. The City has budgeted in the upcoming 2018-2019 fiscal year budget such transfers which are not repaid. The following is an explanation of those transfers.

Each year the City reserves money in the Capital Projects Fund for vehicle and equipment replacement. Each Enterprise Fund pays its fair share into that reserve. The City will transfer a set figure from each of the Utility Enterprise Funds (Water, Sewer, Storm Water, and Pressurized Irrigation), to the Capital Projects Fund for vehicle and equipment replacement.

The amounts budgeted to be transferred are as follows:

* Transfer from the Water Fund to the Capital Projects Fund	\$ 35,000
* Transfer from the Sewer Fund to the Capital Projects Fund	\$ 35,000
* Transfer from the Pressurized Irrigation Fund to the Capital Projects Fund	\$ 35,000
* Transfer from the Storm Water Fund to the Capital Projects Fund	\$ 35,000

Utah State Code also requires that the City provide an annual disclosure of the equivalent charges the City would pay on utilities provided by the City for Water, Sewer, Storm Water, and Pressurized Irrigation. The City will transfer a set figure between the General Fund and each of the Utility Enterprise Funds (Water, Sewer, Storm Water, and Pressurized Irrigation), the amount of equivalent utility charge for each utility as follows:

* Water Fund	\$ 12,792
* Sewer Fund	\$ 2,935
* Pressurized Irrigation Fund	\$ 93,527
* Storm Water Fund	\$ 180

A public hearing will be held during the regular meeting of the Mapleton City Council on Wednesday, June 20, 2018 at 7:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers, located at the Mapleton City Building, 125 W Community Center Way (400 N), Mapleton, Utah, to consider;

- Interfund transfers in the upcoming Fiscal Year 2018-2019 budget from the Water, Sewer, Pressurized Irrigation, and Storm Water Funds to the Capital Projects Fund for vehicle and equipment replacement, and
- Interfund transfers of the equivalent charge for the City's usage of each of the City's utilities.
