Street Parking

Now is the time to clear the streets of your vehicles, trailers and landscaping piles, etc. to prepare for winter street parking enforcement. Mapleton City Code (10.05.070) prohibits parking on any street between the hours of 11pm to 6am beginning November 15, 2018 until March 15, 2019, regardless if there is snow on the roadway or not. In addition, parking violation warnings or citations may be issued and/or impoundment of vehicles and trailers in violation. If you receive a parking warning tag, please remove your vehicles immediately to avoid further enforcement. In addition, it is a violation of Mapleton City Code to leave vehicles and trailers parked in the same place on the roadway continuously for 72 hours throughout the rest of the year.

Sprinkler Systems

In our freezing climate, it is advisable to "winterize" your sprinkler system to avoid damage. Winterizing your sprinklers is a critical step in sprinkler system maintenance. Without proper winterization, residual water can freeze over the winter causing the pipe, fittings or valves to crack. This leads to a very unpleasant surprise in the spring when you turn your system on for the season and have major leaks which can require costly repairs and high-water bills.

Special attention should be given to draining water from the pipes, valves and sprinkler heads, before freezing occurs. Make sure that your stop and waste is completely shut off if your system is on culinary water and if you have pressurized irrigation, you may shut off YOUR valve, but DO NOT shut off the city valve (where the valve connects to the meter).
